National public sector strike planned for 10th May in the United Kingdom

Dear Customer,

we inform you that there could be inconveniences for travellers in **United Kingdom** due to a **public sector strike** that will affect transport, including immigration control, on **10th May**.

A lot of members from various unions, including Rail, Maritime and Transport (RMT), Immigration Services and Public and Commercial Services have announced they intend to participate in the action on 10^{th} May.

The move will affect UK border control points, potentially adding further **delays at Heathrow's passport control**.

Transport for London (TfL) is expecting services to run as normal. However, it advises that travellers check for updates on the TfL site over the next few days: <u>www.tfl.gov.uk</u>.

Air traffic controllers will not be participating in the industrial action due to the proposed strike relating to public sector workers only, not NATS.
